Scope:



The aim of this initiative is to provide the Parish/Town Councils/Groups with a solution for managing incidences where the vegetation within the boundary of an owner/occupier residence obstructs/inconveniences the public highway/footway



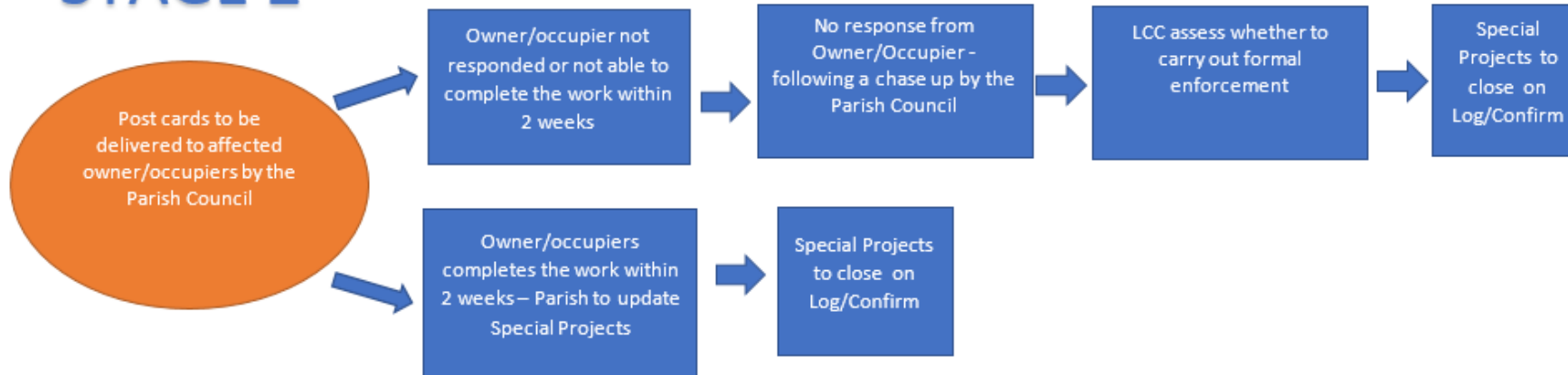
The initiative will provide guidance, information and support to empower Parish/Town Councils/Groups

Key points:

- ▶ To be used only where the overgrown vegetation is in owner/occupier residence onto a highway/footway (including Public Rights of Way (PROW)).
- ▶ Not to be used for non-highway issues and between owner/occupier residences.
- ▶ Printed post cards will be provided by LCC.
- ▶ The responsibility for resident communication and managing the responses/feedback from the affected residents is with the Parish/Town Councils/Groups and not LCC.
- ▶ The period March to August must be avoided due to the main breeding season for nesting birds, although as this is weather dependant.

Benefits

- ▶ Supporting communities to improve their environments.
- ▶ Increased autonomy
- ▶ Empowering communities to act swiftly to prioritise local issues
- ▶ Reduction in number of complaints/enquiries
- ▶ Joint working to reduce unnecessary formalities
- ▶ Utilise LCC's guidance and training – initial assessments made by enforcement team.
